Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant, named for the famous college football coach of the University of Alabama, is a separate summer world designed especially for the young—where boys and girls grow in mind and muscle to become men and women. During a summer at Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant, boys and girls have fun and form lasting friendships. More importantly, they build a basis for better adult-living. We build two kinds of strength—that of sinew and that of spirit. A young person must develop both of these to accept the responsibilities and conquer the challenges that are sure to come his way on the road to adulthood. Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's philosophy is a dual one—to promote physical prowess through athletic participation while instilling a positive attitude toward authority and competition and development of good sportsmanship—qualities that will hold in good stead through the camper's adult years. 


Activities abound at Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant and they're as varied as the campers' interests. Campers are guided to participate in general, as well as special, sports including:





FACILITIES

Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant's main building is a rustic lodge which hosts group activities and crafts and houses the dispensary, the resident director's quarters, the kitchen and dining hall. A trained dietitian plans the healthy, hearty menus and supervises the completely modern kitchen. Food is served cafeteria style from steam tables which keep it piping hot. The dining hall, which will seat 250 people, is a favorite spot for all campers.

HOUSING

Campers are housed in comfortable lodge-type huts. Each hut is divided into two private units, each with quarters for campers and their counselors. There are complete bath facilities within each hut.

CAMP AREA


Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant's 180 acres include a regulation track, stables, riding trails, three tennis courts, boat dock, Junior Olympic size swimming pool, and beach area gym.

GYM

The large gym houses a regulation basketball court, volley-ball area and ping-pong tables. All water sports equipment is stored here for easy accessibility.


STAFF

The staff includes the resident director, assistant director, waterfront director, and horseback director plus counselors, dietitian, cooks and nurse. In addition to the qualified, experienced counselors, Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant engages coaches and special instructors, each an expert in his field.



BOATS

Lake Logan Martin offers opportunities to enjoy all water sports. Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant equipment includes six boats, rafts, canoes, paddle boats and sail boats. If it floats and it's fun—it's included in the Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant fleet!



GENERAL INFORMATION

WORSHIP

Non-denominational chapel services are held in the dining hall each Sunday morning by guest ministers. Nearby communities have services for various denominations and transportation is provided as required.

TUTORING

Tutoring will be arranged in basic elementary and high school subjects and is not included in the basic fee. Inquire regarding special educational needs and interests. All teachers are state accredited.


RESERVATIONS

Since its opening June 3, 1967, campers from Tennessee, Florida, Louisiana, Arkansas, Washington, D. C., Georgia, Alabama and other states, including one from far-away California, have enjoyed wonderful weeks at Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant. Suggested ages for campers are 5-14. For reservations, complete the enclosed application form. A deposit of \$35.00, 100% refundable if application withdrawn prior to April 15th, must accompany application. A 5% discount will be granted for the second child in the same family. Complete physical examination (which will be forwarded upon receipt of application) must be submitted prior to start of session selected. If applicant is not accepted, deposit will be refunded.

CAMP BANK

It is suggested that each camper deposit \$7.00 per week in the Camp Bank for canteen, trips, hair-cuts, laundry, etc. Stationery, T-shirts, and shorts (Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant), arts and crafts materials, cokes, candy, etc. will be on sale at the Canteen.





PACKING FOR CAMP PAUL "BEAR" BRYANT


For a four-week session at Camp Paul "Bear" Bryant, it is suggested that campers bring the following:

SALES MEETING **AND CONVENTIONS**



Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant is well known to most everyone in the country as not only one


